

Azad University of Agriculture & Technology, Kanpur. The College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Mathura became its first constituent college. The parent institution of this University had the distinction of being the first Veterinary College set up in independent India in 1947. It was the first Veterinary College in Asia to start with degree programme in Veterinary Science and to start M.V.Sc/M.Sc degree programmes in various disciplines of Veterinary and Animal Sciences in 1951 and the Ph.D. degree programmes in 1953. Ever since the establishment of this College, it has contributed significantly not only in terms of number of graduates and post-graduates of high Scholastic order, but also quality research of national and international standards. This College has a glorious past and the distinction of having its alumni holding high positions in India and abroad as teachers, research workers, policy-makers, consultants and administrators.

ABOUT MATHURA

Mathura is located at 27.4924°N 77.6737°E in the western region of Uttar Pradesh. The city spans an area of approximately 39 km² and lies at an altitude of 174 metres (571 feet) above sea level. Mathura is an ancient city and holds immense religious and cultural significance as the birthplace of Lord Krishna, making it a prominent pilgrimage site in India. It was historically a flourishing centre of culture, religion, and trade during the Maurya, Shunga, Kushan, and Gupta periods. Mathura forms an important part of the Braj region, often referred to as the "Land of Krishna". The city is renowned for its ancient temples, ghats, and sacred sites along the Yamuna River, along with museums and heritage structures. Mathura experiences a humid subtropical climate with three distinct seasons: summer, monsoon, and winter. Summers are typically very hot, while winters are relatively mild and pleasant. The most suitable time to visit Mathura is during the post-monsoon and winter months, especially from October to March, when the climate is more comfortable and festive activities are in full swing.

TOURIST ATTRACTIONS

It is particularly known for Krishna Janmabhoomi, Dwarkadhish Temple, and the vibrant celebration of Janmashtami and Holi. Mathura is also famous for its traditional sweets, pichkari and gulal used during Holi, and sculptures, pottery, and textile handicrafts. The nearby town Vrindavan too has renowned tourist attractions such as Prem Mandir, Banke Bihari Temple etc.
